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Teaching skills

- Selecting learning activities/Presenting learning activities
- Preparing students for new learning
- Asking questions
- Checking students understanding
- Providing opportunities for practice of new items
- Monitoring students learning
- Giving feedback on student learning
- Reviewing and re-teaching when necessary
- Preparation of communicative interaction activities
organization and facilitation of communicative interaction
- Judgment of proper balance between fluency and accuracy
- Awareness of learner's errors/Appropriate treatment of errors
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General Communication Skills

- Personality, presence, general style
- Voice-audibility ability to project
- Voice –clarity, speed, diction
- Ability to establish/maintain rapport
- Language proficiency

Classroom discourse contains a specific set of speech acts and functions. These include:

- Requesting, ordering, giving rules
- Establishing attention
- Questioning
- Repeating and reporting what has been said
- Giving instructions
