Secondary and Higher Secondary School Teacher

If you want to take up teaching as a profession but only for higher secondary classes, then you must follow this career path. Secondary school teachers are responsible for teaching students of class 5 to class 10. Higher Secondary school teachers are involved in teaching students of class 11 and 12. As a Secondary or Higher Secondary school teacher you can teach specific subjects as per your graduation or post-graduation degree.

How to become a Secondary and Higher Secondary School Teacher?

- After completing graduation in any subject, you can do a Bachelor in Education (B.Ed.) degree, which is a 2-year teacher training program. A B.Ed. a degree is a basic requirement to pursue a career in teaching in a secondary and higher secondary school.
- You can do a Master's degree after graduation and then do a B.Ed. to teach students in higher secondary classes or those who are in class 11 and 12.
- To qualify for central government-run schools and some private schools, you will need to qualify in the Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET).
- The Central Board of Secondary
 Education (CBSE) conducts the Central
 Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET) for
 candidates to be eligible to teach at the
 secondary and higher secondary levels.

 Moreover, some states conduct a separate Teacher Eligibility Test (TET) or a State Level Eligibility Test (SLET) or a similar test conducted by the school service commission for recruiting secondary level and higher secondary level teachers at Government-run schools as well as Government aided schools.

College and University Teacher

If you are interested in teaching as a profession but only wish to teach in colleges or universities, then you can follow this career pathway. College and university teachers, also called lecturers at the beginning of a career in teaching, are the senior-most qualified teaching professionals. They teach in government or private colleges and universities.

How to become a College or University Teacher?

- To become eligible for a career in teaching in a college or university, you must have at least a Master's level degree. However, a Ph.D. degree is mandatory for promotion from the position of a Lecturer to that of an Associate Professor.
- After completing a Master's degree, you will need to apply for and qualify in the National Eligibility Test (NET) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA).
- A postgraduate degree and a certification of eligibility in the NET are two mandatory requirements for becoming a university teacher or lecturer. This is the highest position and the most sought career pathway for those looking for a career in teaching.
