



United Nations Environment Program (UNEP)

- UNEP established on 5th June, 1972 as a Suborganization of United Nations.
- Its headquarter is in Nairobi, kenya.
- UNEP is an agency that coordinates environmental activities and assisting developing countries in implementing environmentally sound policies and practices.
- UNEP also has six regional offices and various country offices.



Structure

- It is led by United Nations Under-Secretary-General and Executive Director, and Supported by a Deputy Director.
- It works through its divisions, regional, liaison and out-posted offices. It also hosts several environmental conventions, secretariats and interagency coordinating bodies. It is almost entirely funded by direct, voluntary contributions -largely from Member States.
